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## Living Expectations

WorldView Center expectations are laid out for applicants in order that they might make the most educated decision possible about whether this program is the right fit for their ministry training and future goals. Please feel free to call about any questions you may have regarding specific issues your personal circumstances may entail. WorldView Center is an enriching and distinctive living and learning experience for participants, and we hope it will be a good fit for you as well.

### Admission to WorldView

- WorldView is open to enrolled graduate students, interns, visiting scholars or faculty members, who are committed followers of Jesus Christ. Applicants are judged on their interest in WorldView and readiness to participate. WorldView admits residents from as many diverse cultures as possible (including North Americans). Preference will be given to F-1 students and those in intercultural programs.
- Upon receiving all portions of the application packet, an interview will be scheduled with the applicant to further assess their fit into the WorldView program and WorldView's fit into their ministry goals.
- Length of stay—Preference is give to applicants who will commit to either the full academic year or a complete semester. Some rooms are reserved for students commuting for intensive courses.

### WorldView Provisions to Residents

- **Accommodations**
  - Single rooms are furnished with dresser, bookcase, desk lamps and chair, bed, blankets, sheets, pillow and case, towels, curtains, and walk-in closet. A few have bathrooms. Average room size is 11'x17'.
  - Interlinking rooms have a bathroom, but not a kitchen.
  - Apartments have a bath and a kitchenette.
  - Suites of two or three rooms have a full bath and a kitchenette.

*All rooms, apartments and suites are fully furnished including dishes. The cost of utilities (electricity, heat and cooling, water, garbage collection) is included in the rent cost.*
- **Telephones** and local phone service are provided for a monthly fee of \$21. Each room has a private phone line. Long distance calls are made with phone cards that residents purchase.
- **Dining room service** is available for all meals. Residents may prepare light meals if they live in an apartment or suite, though all residents take their main evening meal in the dining room to increase opportunity for community interaction. A small "snack kitchen" is available for residents of single or interlinking rooms.
- **Communication service** includes personal mailboxes for letters and packages. There is also a fax and copy machine for use at standard charges.
- **Study facilities** include desks in each room, a library and computer lab. There are two classrooms.
- **The Chapel** is normally open at all times for personal prayer and meditation.
- **Other facilities** include a recreation room with equipment, laundry room with washers, dryers and irons, a lounge, television and VCR, and a number of public restrooms. Entrances and restrooms are wheelchair accessible.
- **Security**—Entrances to WorldView are kept locked at all times to give maximum protection. Access to WorldView is by confidential code using a key pad at the door.
- **Room keys** will be issued to residents for a deposit.
- **Parking** is limited. Residents must apply for permission to park at WorldView parking lots or on the street in front, due to the limited space available for parking. Preferences will be given to those needing a car for internships or health reasons. Beyond this preference, spaces are distributed at a first come, first serve basis.



## Lifestyle Agreement

- Residents of WorldView Center are expected to live according to their Christian identity, with love and humility, in order to best understand fellow residents' background regarding cultural and theological differences.
- Residents are expected to maintain appropriate interaction between sexes, keeping in mind different expectations of other cultures.
- WorldView Center is a drug free environment. Therefore, residents are not permitted to use addictive drugs, nicotine, or alcohol.
- Pornography in any form will not be tolerated.
- Pets are not permitted at WorldView Center.

## Expectations of Residents

- Residents are expected to **participate in the life of the community**—social, spiritual, and study activities. Residents are expected to learn how to, and participate in, ministry to others as a regular part of living in the WorldView community. This is a significant weekly time commitment of about 8 hours a week, made up of: class “Creating Understanding” - 1hr; community worship- 1.5 hrs; common meal conversation- 3 hrs; community service- 2 hrs; community sharing & business- 1 hr. per month.
- **Community Sharing Times** will be held every two weeks for both business and fellowship. Participation is required of all residents. In the Fall semester new residents will participate in an a 2.5 day intensive orientation and training for life at WorldView. In the Spring semester new residents must commit to an hour a week for orientation and an introduction to WorldView.
- **Commit to learning and practicing intercultural ministry and living:**
  - Learning and adjusting to other lifestyles, manners, and courtesies.
  - Seek the welfare of others in the house—a practical outworking of “in honor preferring one another.” In practice, this will mean seeking to follow the preferences of other cultures rather than assuming personal patterns are preferred and appropriate for all.
  - Learn of the whole world—expanding awareness, knowledge and concern for those areas outside your own group and nation.
- **Readiness to assume responsibility for the tasks of living.**
  - In most cases, at least two hours per week from each resident will be necessary for these jobs to be adequately completed—in the kitchen, cleaning, grounds, or assisting with the maintenance of WorldView Center. There will also be optional work days available for the community.
  - Some tasks will require full or part time employees. Where possible these positions will be open first to internationals; second, to other residents; and third, to non-WorldView residents.
  - It is hoped that applicants will commit to a minimum of one semester, with preference given for one academic year. Residents have the option to sign a lease for a cheaper monthly rate. However, if residents move out before the committed time, the remainder of costs for their lease agreed time period must be paid.

- Utilities (heat, air conditioning, electricity, water, garbage)
- Use of library and study rooms
- Laundry room at reduced rate, as well as use of vacuum cleaners and carpet shampooer
- Free use of computers with high speed internet access
- Lounge with TV, snack kitchen, recreation room and equipment, and chapel
- Fully furnished rooms including furniture and linens
- Availability of fax and copy machines (with usage fee) and office supplies, such as paper hole punch, paper cutter, stapler and scissors
- Van available to rent for a small fee.

The Location is near beautiful Mt. Tabor park and is walking distance from Western Seminary. The schools near by are considered some of the best in the Portland area. We are on easy access for East/West and North/South Bus routes – this makes it less necessary to purchase a car.
